Origin of the innovation

In 2020, the Bogota City Council, through Demolab, its public innovation lab, launched the Itinerant Citizens' Assembly (ICA).





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Itinerant Citizens' Assembly

- The first Citizens' Assembly in Colombia.
- One of the first deliberative mini-publics in Latin America
- One of the eight cases of institutionalization in the world of deliberative democracy identified by the OECD and the only one in the Global South.
- Mixed governance model.

itinerancy:

multi-body deliberation


The ICA has different "chapters."

distributed deliberation Chapters have different purposes. For example, one explores objectives, a second promulgates a policy, and a third conducts an evaluation.

sequential deliberation

Each chapter tries to learn from the previous ones.

Council members report that they have used more than 25% of citizens' recommendations.

Citizens improve their trust and image of the Council after participating in the Assembly.

Citizens feel more engaged with the problems of the city

Election debates with the candidates for mayor, in which the results of the ICA were presented and used.



ICA has been included in the Council's action plan for the last 4 years.

Councillors participate as part of the training of experts and call random citizens directly to invite them to participate.

Civil servants are trained in deliberative democracy and participate as part of the assembly staff.





Lessons learned

- political will shapes the world, the interesting thing is to learn how to hack these scenarios.
- citizen assemblies do not have a single design.
- the commitment of the institutions is key, they must understand and accept to give up a little of their power.

Political recommandations

- advocacy is one of the greatest challenges, the question remains how to guarantee participation and generate ownership of these exercises.
- assemblies should not necessarily compete with the representative system; they can strengthen it and open up more spaces for direct citizen decision-making
- the success of the citizens' assemblies of these times is to demonstrate that multi-stakeholder work is possible.
