







5th International Forum of Participatory Democracy in Africa (FIDEPA 05)

Cotonou - BENIN, August 8 - 10, 2024



CONCEPT NOTE

1. BACKGROUND AND RATIONALE

The global and regional context is marked by remarkable facts notably:

i. The crisis of representative democracy, the illustrations of which range from citizens' disinterest in elections to challenges to the constitutional order, including demands for space for participation between two elections. This crisis varies in intensity from one country to another, with the result: lack of confidence, mistrust or even distrust in public institutions.

ii. The persistent economic crisis and the degradation of the social fabric in several countries in Africa can also be attributed to a lack of participation in elections.

Existing models are essentially based on the timely organization of elections for the devolution of executive, legislative and local power. However, participatory democracy, intervening between elections and seeking to ensure the participation of citizens and various stakeholders in the management of mandates, offers better prospects for development that should be explored,

from the local to the national level.

iii. The end of the global health crisis (Covid 19), which should allow the economic recovery of countries and territories of Africa. Covid 19, reminding us of the environmental, economic, health, safety, food issues etc.... invites us to a new development paradigm the inclusiveness based on participatory democracy and the important role that cities and territories must assume, alongside States, while respecting the subsidiarity principle.

iv. And finally, the multiple transitions, which mark the world in general and Africa in a specific way and whose rhythms and scale are unprecedented in the demographic, economic, political, climatic, energetic domain etc... These profound changes will have impacts and repercussions in cities and territories, which should push them to question these transitions to make the most of them in terms of positioning.



The Cotonou International Forum will therefore be a major meeting to fructify knowledge, practices and identify avenues of action in order to ward off what some actors call "the economic sterility of democracy".

This current crisis environment highlights the urgency of rethinking our governance models and to promote innovative solutions to overcome the challenges we face.

By encouraging citizen participation and strengthening participatory democracy mechanisms. restore we can trust governments. between citizens and strengthen social cohesion and promote a sustainable and inclusive development. In this context, cities in Africa and around the world are inventing solutions to make participatory democracy the basis of economic social and development, responsible citizenship and territorial cohesion. These solutions deserve to be capitalized on and developed further so that they are accessible, not only to the municipal world, but also to States and actors from civil society and universities.

The Cotonou forum offers the opportunity share good practices, stimulate dialogue between stakeholders in civil international society. leaders and institutions, and to formulate concrete recommendations to strengthen citizenship and participatory democracy. By unifying our efforts and by working together we can build a better future for all.

The Cotonou's International Forum proposes to discuss the overall theme: "Citizenship and participatory democracy as a stimulus lever in a context of geopolitical, economical and transitional crisis".





2. OBJECTIVES AND OUTCOMES

The city of Cotonou holds the Presidency of IOPD Africa and intends to organize the 5th International Forum for Participatory Democracy (FIDEPA 05).

Strongly supported by the Government of President Patrice TALON, the City of Cotonou intends to make the 5th edition of the FIDEPA a historic meeting both in the quality of the reflections and the cultural development and sightseeing.

This forum will provide the opportunity actors and practitioners decentralization, governance and local development to exchange with experts in the sector of citizenship and participatory democracy in order to elucidate the current issues linked to geopolitical. the economical transitional crises in Africa. Through exchanges of experiences and good practices, it will be a question of finding innovative approaches to revive democratic societies and strengthen citizen participation.

Thus, the objectives set are:

- Reflect on active citizenship and democratic participation as means of consolidating acquired democratic knowledge and the strengthening of social cohesion in Africa and the world;
- Share experiences, challenges, advances and processes limitations of participatory democracy on the continent;
- Promote benchmarking, exchange on good practices and policies and connection between territorial communities and different actors of the participatory democracy;

• Develop concrete recommendations and actions in order to promote a democratic, effective and inclusive relaunch.

The expected results are:

- A better understanding of the issues linked to citizenship and participatory democracy in a context of political, economical and transitional crises:
- A fruitful exchange of experiences and good practices between the different actors present at the Forum;
- The formulation of concrete recommendations to strengthen citizen participation and consolidate democratic processes;
- Dissemination of the Forum's results through publications and advocacy actions among political decisionmakers and civil society.

Each IOPD Africa Forum offers a broad space for reflection, sharing experiences, building new knowledge and innovations. Each represents a real opportunity for opening up to the world, meeting people and networking.

The particularity of the Cotonou Forum is that there will be a special session on decentralized cooperation around the issues of participatory democracy. Through this special session, the presidency of the IOPD Africa wishes to strengthen collaboration between the continent's cities, CSOs and universities on the theme of local democracy, as a pillar of democracy in our States.

3. DISCUSSIONS

The International Forum which will mobilize participants from African countries and the World will look into a "Citizenship central theme: participatory democracy as recovery lever in the context of geopolitical, economical and transitional crises". inaugural conference emphasizes this central theme will be introduced bv two eminent (2) personalities.

The inaugural conference will be followed by three (3) panels, which will successively address the themes:

- human rights and citizenship: a territorial response to economic and geopolitical crises;
- participatory democracy in the establishment of an inspiring and inclusive governance apparatus;
- overview, issues and challenges of participatory democracy to better support transitions.

During the six (6) parallel sessions, panelists and participants will have the opportunity to address the themes:

Session 1: Strengthening community resilience through local initiatives in response to economical, geopolitical and health crises;

Session 2: Inclusion and equal rights: promoting active citizenship in the context of promoting grassroots development;

Session 3: Citizen engagement and collaborative decision-making: challenges and opportunities for inclusive governance;

Session 4: Transparency and accountability in democratic governance: promoting trust and legitimacy;

Session 5: Sharing experiences on participatory budget;

Session 6: Participatory Budget models and methods of implementing a participatory budget in a local government.



4. ORGANIZATION METHODOLOGY

The international forum is planned during three days and the work will be structured around different highlights:

- an opening plenary session, which will be introduced by an inaugural conference;
- high-level panels in plenary, which will be introduced by political, scientific and civil society figures;
- parallel sessions in workshops and small groups;
- a special session;
- a ceremony to present the trophies of

the Local Leadership Excellence Award authorities. to local academics. researchers and journalists, communicators, having documented good practices and innovations in territorial governance, but also to government authorities having made maior advances in promoting decentralization. governance and development.

- reading of the final declaration and;
- Closure.

5. PRESENTATION OF THE CITY OF COTONOU AND FORUM VENUE

Economic capital of Benin, Cotonou is made up of a population of 679,012 inhabitants (4th RGPH) and has the same characteristics as most large African cities namely: high rate urbanization, densification of economic activities, establishment of large institutions.

According to statistics, trading, catering, accommodation (40.5%)."other services" (24.7%)and "manufacturing industries" (14.6%) constitute the branches of activity that predominate in Cotonou. These services are the most developed sectors because of the geostrategic position of the city, corridor, port platform, administrative and political city. In this dynamic, the city of Cotonou offers enormous touristic opportunities (picturesque beaches and riverbanks lagoons) with dominance of such sites, the majority of which constitute deities.

makes available Cotonou to participants of 5 star hotels, the impressive Palais des Congrès. Around this den of conferences, one can find the best hotels in Benin with comfortable rooms and a XXL service in the image of Beninese hospitality. VIP vehicles and buses will ensure the movement of participants. In addition to these opportunities, there's the chance to share the culinary art of Benin, one of the best in Africa, field visits and tourist circuit from Cotonou to Ouidah by the Route des Pêches or from Cotonou to Porto-Novo or in Ganvié nicknamed the Venice of Africa.



It might also be possible to go to Abomey, a historic town, 120 km from Cotonou or in the north of Benin which is full of important tourist sites.


The State-Cotonou partnership will allow participants to benefit from:
