

MANAGEMENT REPORT 2017-2018



This document presents the Technical Secretariat's management report for the period between the 17th and 18th IOPD Conferences (July 2017 and November 2018).

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INTRODUCTION

The International Observatory for Participatory Democracy was set up in November 2001, as part of the European Commission's decentralised cooperation projects. Since then, the network of local governments, municipal entities, research centres and civil society bodies that make up the IOPD has gradually increased its membership, creating new meeting spaces and furthering reflection and the exchange of knowledge on participatory democracy.

Barcelona City Council has held the office of Technical Secretariat since the IOPD was set up. And since 2006, the IOPD has been working with United Cities and Local Governments (UCLG), under an agreement for the operation and maintenance of the IOPD's Technical Secretariat.

The Technical Secretariat has worked to position the IOPD as a global benchmark centre for the production of innovative knowledge, and to establish it as a space for sharing participatory democracy experiences from around the world.

The report we present below describes the activities and projects carried out by the IOPD from June 2017 to November 2018, in line with the network's annual conference calendar.

As the city of Barcelona took on both the Presidency and the General Secretariat of the network, during this period, the present Report includes both the day-to-day operation of the network and the preparatory work for the 18th IOPD Conference. The city of Barcelona, over the course of the present year, has reinforced the Technical Secretariat through the recruitment of two new people.

The present Report was closed on 5th November, in terms of the enrolment of new members and web and social network profiles viewing data.

I ACTIVITIES: PREPARATION FOR THE 18TH IOPD CONFERENCE

Since Barcelona was chosen the new IOPD Presidency, the Technical Secretariat has worked together with the Barcelona City Council to organize the event. The Technical Secretariat has been part of the organizing committee and has collaborated in the technical and programmatic preparation of the event.



Mention must be made of the preparatory activities for holding the Conference, along with the work meetings held throughout 2018, which are dealt with in the first part of the Report.

Moreover, as is customary, the General Secretariat has taken on the preparation for the General Assembly, work that entails the preparing and translation of all of the necessary documentation (Management Report, Work Plan and Agenda), along with making sure that everybody knows about it.

With regard to the Awards Ceremony, arrangements have been made for the attendance of representatives of both the winner of the IOPD Best Practices in Citizen Participation Distinction and the projects that have been awarded special mentions.

I ACTIVITIES: IOPD WORKING GROUPS

The IOPD habitually runs Work Groups, in which different network members come together for the specific purpose of debating certain themes or work areas. However, as the network is currently engaged in a phase of internal reflection, at the Montreal Assembly in 2017, the decision was made to keep the Work Groups on hold and focus instead on internal reflection.

This has resulted in the setting up of two internal consultations, one related to the network's model of governance and the other concerning the drafting of an Agenda for Local Democracy, to be approved as the final resolution of the 18th IOPD Conference. These two work process have been channelled through the [PARTICIPATE IOPD](#) Platform (see subsection II.4). In both cases the Presidency, following a series of bilateral consultations with reference network cities, has presented two proposals, so that members can make amendments thereto or attach their commentaries.

I ACTIVITIES: 12TH IOPD AWARD

For another year, the General Secretariat called on those local and regional governments that are members of the network to enter their projects for the IOPD Best Practices in Citizen Participation Distinction, which this year will be awarded for the twelfth time. In the present edition **65 local and regional governments** presented their candidacies, featuring projects from the following countries: Albania, Argentina, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Denmark, Ecuador, France, Indonesia, Italy, Madagascar, Malaysia, Mauritania, Mexico, Mozambique, Palestine, Peru, Portugal, Russia, Spain, Sweden, Taiwan, Tunis, Turkey and Uruguay.

The candidacies have been evaluated by a jury of experts, after passing through an initial evaluation stage by members of the IOPD through the [PARTICIPATE IOPD Platform](#) (more information on this in subsection II.4). The goal of this initial phase has been, on the one hand, to provide visibility to all of the proposals and, on the other, to gather the opinions of the members with regard to all of the proposals presented. The 20 proposals that received the most votes were passed on to the next phase and have now been evaluated by a jury of experts. As is the case every year, the winner of the Distinction, along with the special mentions, will be made public during the holding of the Annual Conference.

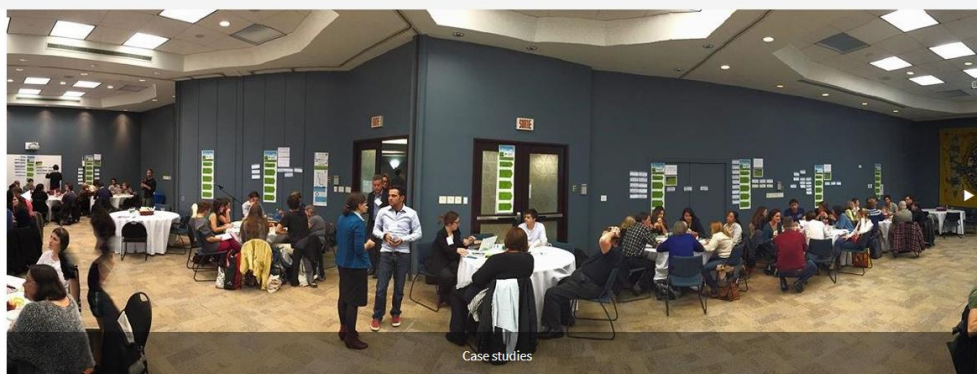

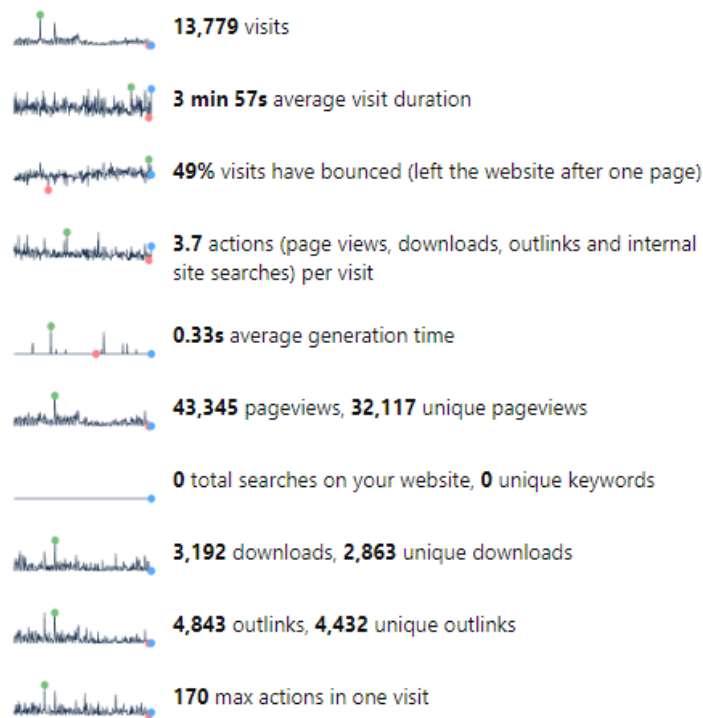

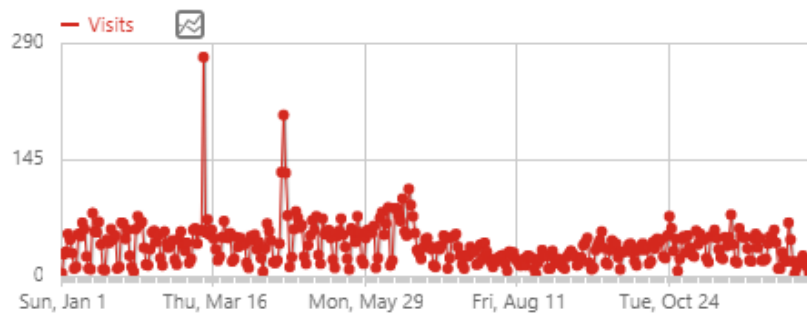

II IOPD WEBSITES: THE IOPD CONFERENCE WEBSITE

[The 18th IOPD Conference website](#) was created for the purpose of informing those persons attending the Conference or interested in the event, as well as serving as a site for the processing of registrations, the web has seven main pages:

- About: General information about the event.
- How to collaborate: Information about the ways in which you can collaborate.
- Program: Description of all of the sessions.
- Speakers: Photos and biographies of all of the speakers at both roundtables and workshops.
- Registration: Information regarding the registration process, along with a link to Eventbrite, the company in charge of ticketing for the Conference.
- Practical Information: This page includes advice for questions such as where to stay and how to get about during the event.

- News: A page that includes brief news bulletins related to the holding of the Conference.



II IOPD WEBSITES: THE 18TH IOPD CONFERENCE APP

A mobile app has been developed for Conference participants, designed to save paper as it avoids the need to print copies of the program or other information, as well as providing a channel of communication with the speakers.

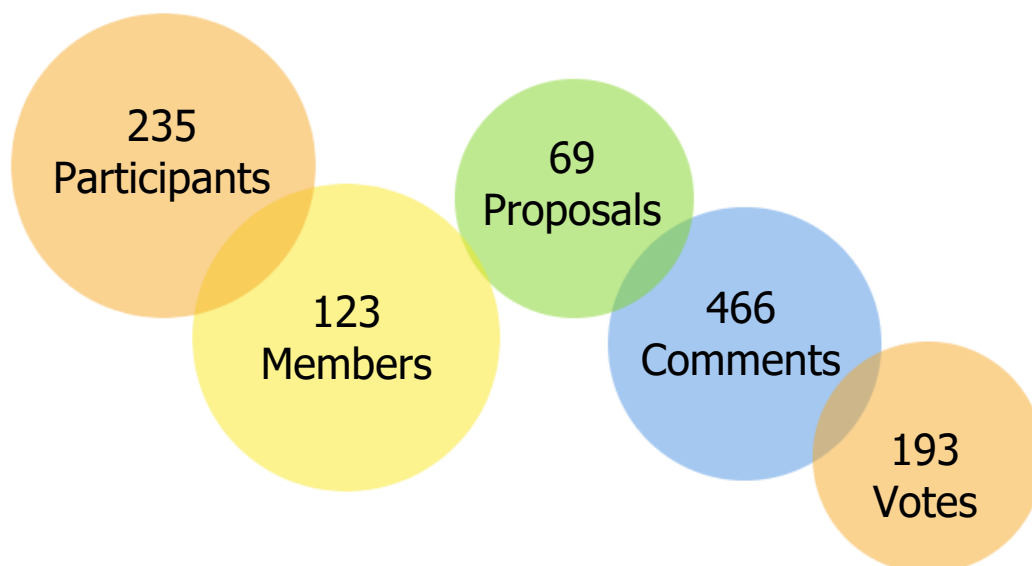


II IOPD WEBSITES: PARTICIPATE IOPD PLATFORM

Launched this year, coinciding with the convening of the 12th IOPD Distinction, PARTICIPATE IOPD is the IOPD debate platform. Through this platform local and regional governments have presented their candidacies and IOPD members who have logged on to the platform have been able to comment and vote on the different projects presented.

Apart from the Distinction, two other consultations have also taken place using this platform, one on the participatory process for the drafting of the Agenda for Local Democracy, and the other for a debate about the IOPD governance model. PARTICIPATE IOPD has been based on the decidim.barcelona infrastructure.

On 2 November 2018, the platform had 235 participants, of which 123 had been validated as IOPD members. A total of 466 commentaries have been registered.

III COMMUNICATION

Did you know?

Publication of an international study on citizen initiatives at local level

The IOPD and the Barcelona City Council have commissioned a group of researchers from the *Universitat Pompeu Fabra* in Barcelona, led by Pau Alarcón, to carry out a global study of citizen initiatives at the local level. The IOPD technical secretariat participated in the study proposal, reviewed the theoretical framework and the questionnaire, and facilitated contacts with authors in different countries. The publication will be available on the dates of the 18th Conference.

Publication on Pioneer Participatory Budgets in Asia and Russia

The IOPD Secretariat commissioned researcher and professor Yves Cabannes of University College London to study participatory budgeting in Asia and Russia. Professor Cabannes, in collaboration with various Asian research centres and universities, conducted this research and wrote a publication available on the IOPD website.

Report of the Working Group on the Evaluation of Participatory Practices 2016-2017

The Basque Housing Observatory, which coordinated a working group on the evaluation of participatory practices, published the report of this working group.

III COMMUNICATION: NEWSLETTERS

The Technical Secretariat produces newsletters in the Observatory's various working languages, sends copies to its members and individuals who have signed up for the newsletter, and publishes them on its social media profiles. They cover the latest developments, such as new publications or experiences posted on the website, information on upcoming activities and other news of interest.

Other communications are also sent to members in order to share information such as dates, the Conference program, the good-practice award and the working groups.

This year, after bringing together the communications of the Secretariat and those of the Annual Conference, since the middle of 2018 most of the bulletins have been focused on the event, and these have been sent using the MailChimp service.

Why citizen initiative?

Because citizens should be able to organise and to propose new policies to their local governments.

Why ecosystems of inclusive participation?

Because there is no one-size-fits-all participation channel. Different tools need to be combined in order to make participation as inclusive as possible.

Social networks are an essential tool for getting in touch with people from all over the world, sharing our contents and gathering lots of information. We therefore work with the following social networks:

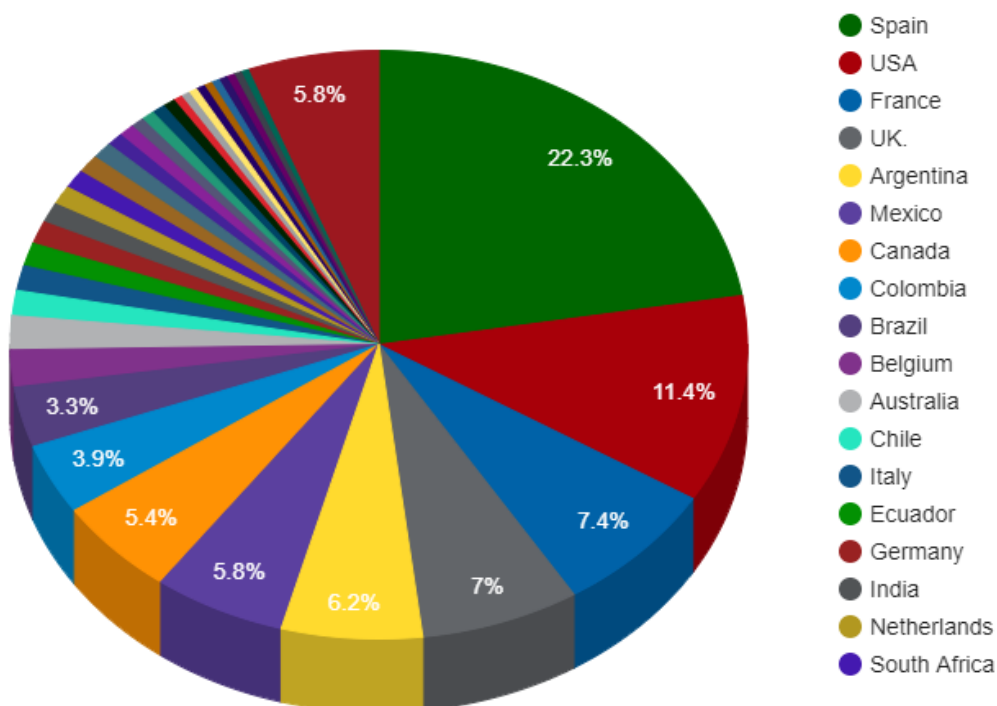


It's the official IOPD Facebook website. There, information about the webpage and other piece of news with an institutional profile are shared. Until the 5th November 2018, the webpage has 1.126 followers (547 followers in June 2017) and 1.086 "likes".



The official Twitter profile **@oidpoipd** has increased its activity by sharing piece of news and interesting links, as well as the institutional information of the observatory. Until the 5th November 2018, the profile has 3.989 followers (before the Montreal conference in May 2017 it has 3.059 followers), it follows 1.288 profiles (a 4,6% more) and has published 10.675 tweets.

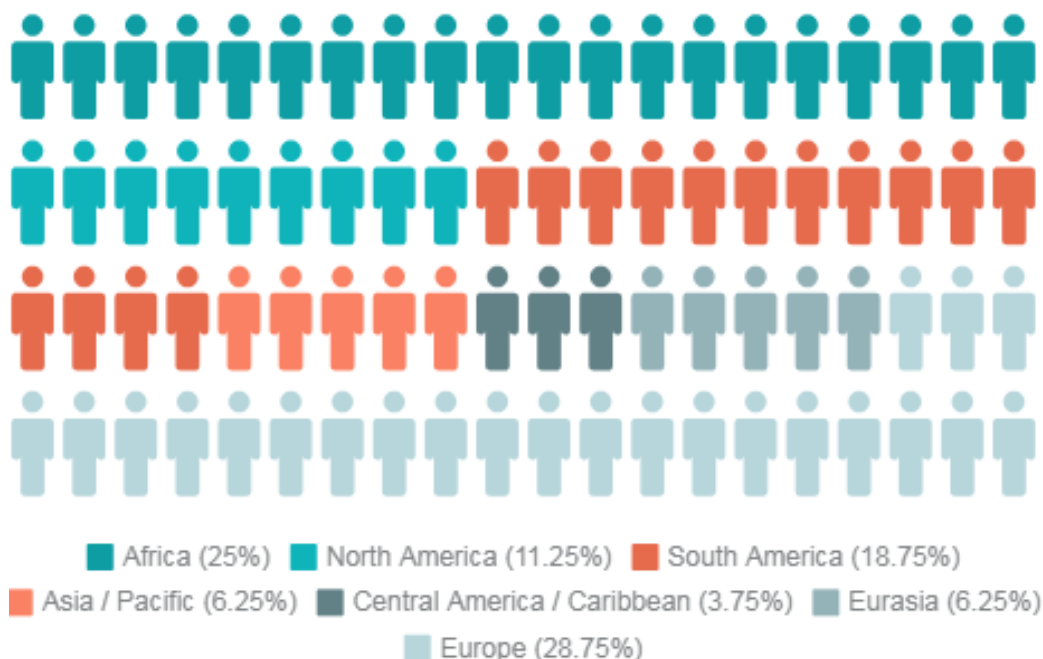
IV NETWORK GROWTH

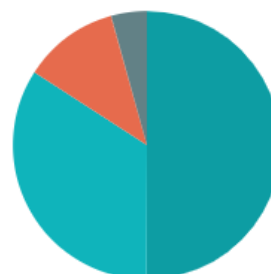
IV NETWORK GROWTH: CLASSIFICATION OF IOPD MEMBERS
