



- FTT is a report by CPD, Law for Black Lives and BYP100
- Examines racial disparities, policing landscapes and budgets in 12 jurisdictions
- Interviews of 24+ organizations about Invest/Divest campaigns they have run in their cities & community safety priorities



- → U.S. criminal legal system targets Black and brown communities & cities' budgets reflect this deeply
- → During the last 30 years there have been drastic cuts to the social safety net --- which disproportionately impacted Black and brown communities
- → We have seen the *increased militarization* of police forces

 across the country and *massive investments* made in arrests,

 incarceration and surveillance



Department	Description	Total Expenditures	% of Total Budget
Police Department	Total Police Department spending	\$321,681,648	30.03%
Housing and Revitalization Department	Includes funding for affordable housing development	\$ <i>75</i> ,534,298	7.05%
Department of Health and Wellness Promotion	Health funding for public health programs and services	\$39,866,177	3.72%
Department of Transportation	Includes public transit services	\$135,072,500	12.61%
General Services Department	Focused primarily on City operations; includes Parks and Recreation, which includes afterschool and summer programming, educational activities	\$134,650,320	12.57%

St. Paul Mayor Carter rejects police chief's call for 50 new cops





But Carter said in his Friday statement: "The philosophy that more police officers, tougher prosecutors and bigger jails equal a safer city has failed. Our driving goal shouldn't be to hire as many officers as possible but to reduce the number of times we have to call police in the first place."
