Summary and methodology	<p>The Workshop was developed based on the Module 1 – Introduction, for the localization of the SDGs.</p> <p>The introduction focused on the principles of the SDGs, and its transition from the millennium goals.</p> <p>Once introduced the intentions of the workshop, were presented four important areas of work in relation to the location of the 2030 Agenda: awareness raising, advocacy, alignment and monitoring.</p> <p>For each work area the participants presented their experiences and questions, while emphasizing the role of local governments and national associations in each of the points.</p> <p>During the second part of the session, the participants worked on a practical exercise based on a proposed example. During the exercise, the participants developed a stakeholder mapping, the process of a public policy in line with three SDGs and a participation strategy for the implementation of the presented policy.</p> <p>The workshop ended with a reflection on the needs of local governments and the importance of thinking about strategies of citizen participation that allow the integration of citizens in the different management models, as well as in the exercises of alignment of the strategic plans with the ODS.</p>
Conclusions	There is a general interest in knowing the 2030 Agenda and its location in the field. The issue of indicators and how to measure
