




the challenges of african cities


Pressing of citizens demand and low uptake of social, economic, cultural, rights.




Governance not sufficiently attentive to the needs of communities exposing them to: (i) health risks; (ii) risks related to vulnerable or hazardous employment; and (iii) external shocks due to natural disasters affecting cities and territories (OECD 2015).













Tools of participatory democracy

The Participatory Budget is defined as a democratic process in which communities participate in the debate on public policies and decide on the public resources available or are involved in decisions on their allocation and monitoring.








