New political majority with environmentalists since july 2020








# The sensitive climate PB : innovation aspects and current chalenges

- Investment budget : EUR 2.5 million








## **Results : mains projects and data**


407 submitted projects,

134 submitted projects to vote,


13 300 votes (5 % of participation)

Lessons from the comparative study. When reading the report, what are the aspects that have particularly affected you and that you think are important? [3 or 4 key ideas]



→ AWARENESS: participatory budgetisation for climate : «huge awareness potential»

→ CREATE A COMMON : despite the diversity of PB formats and territories, the comparative study allows the creation of a global common. This common data reverses the trend of an increasingly globalized world and less globalist world.

→ HILIGHT THE HETEROGENEITY? A typology emerges inside the sustainable development PB (ex: 'Physical' or tangible' CC adaptation projects • 'Physical' or 'tangible' CC mitigation projects • Combined CC adaptation & mitigation projects • Awareness raising and training on climate change • Early warning projects • Climate change studies and information systems)

→ A GOOD SCALE? The municipality scale seems to be essential to build projects and make citizen participate around them. However political changes in municipalities weaken participatory budgeting (ex: San Pedro in Mexico or Agueda in Portugal)
